Connect with the local Worcester community through HC programs: Community-Based Learning (CBL), Student Programs for Urban Development (SPUD), & Community Service Work-Study (CSWS)

CBL Highlights:

- Volunteering through a CBL course (academic credit)
- Semester-long volunteering
- Serve at an agency that fits with your course goals and schedule (agencies are pre-determined by your CBL professor)

SPUD Highlights:

- Volunteering in your free time (no academic credit)
- Semester-long volunteering for 1-2 hours per week
- Serve at an agency that fits with your goals & schedule

CSWS Highlights

- Paid job opportunity (not available to first-year students)
- Students must be work-study eligible
- Work with a FWS eligible agency or nonprofit

(i.e. one position may serve as both a CBL requirement and a CSWS or SPUD placement). Note that there may be fewer volunteer opportunities this fall due to pandemic considerations. Except for CBL students, we cannot quarantee placement for the
